God Word Endures

The grass withers and the flowers fall, but the word of our God endures forever. —Isaiah 40:8

Someone said to me the other day, "It feels like July!" I responded, "I think this has been better than July!" Of course, we were talking about the weather we've had the last few weeks. Personally, I can't think of better weather than clear skies, upper 70s to low 80s and no humidity. Fall has come, but it doesn't really feel like it yet.

That said, it still looks like it. Because it has finally dried out after such a wet spring and most of summer, the grass is withering. And although different varieties of flowers come and go, leaves are falling to the ground. Even if the temperatures don't feel very fall-like, the signs in God's creation are still there.

Now, whether your favorite season is fall or not, I hope that this season causes God's promise to strike your mind and heart as it does mine. Long ago, the Lord spoke through Isaiah: **"The grass withers and the flowers fall, but the word of our God endures forever."**

As beautiful as fall can be, it's also the sign that the dead of winter is coming. Yes, many plants are not dying, only transferring into a state of dormancy, but there are plants that just outright die. Either way, this wasn't the progression God intended for his creation. son of fall is also a reminder of the Fall into sin.

And as we look into our own hearts and lives, we must confess with the hymn writer: "...change and decay in all around I see..." (CW 783). And so we plea with him just the same, "O Lord, abide with me!"

And he most certainly does! The Lord abides with us in every season of the year even as he is with us in every season of life. How? Because "...the word of our God endures forever." And what is that

Word, but the incarnate Word, our Lord Jesus Christ! (John 1:1ff.) God's promises in Christ of loving care, forgiveness of sins and life eternal endure for you personally into eternity!

If the green grass of worldly wealth seems to wither from your bank accounts, remember that you are citizens of the kingdom of heaven, and you have a Father who knows your needs and provides according to his good will and plan.

If your sin leaves you feeling like petals falling from your heart of faith, turn to him who gives you life. Drink deeply from the nourishing sap of the gospel and be renewed in your faith by the forgiveness of sins.

If you find yourself in the fall, even the winter of life, and death's approach leaves you feeling cold and abandoned, abandon yourself on Christ whose body grew cold and lifeless in death so that



eternal life would be breathed into your glorified body on the Last Day.

Whether you enjoy fall or not, let the signs of fall remind you of the undying promise of God that "The grass withers and the flowers fall, but the word of our God endures forever."

Reformation 2024 Celebrates the First Lutheran Hymnal

This year marks the 500th anniversary of the first Lutheran hymnal, *Etlich Cristlich Lider*, also known as *Achtliederbuch* (Eight Song Book). Hymns by Martin Luther, Paul Speratus, and Justus Jonas were compiled, and the small collection was published in early1524. The goal of these writings was to provide songs for worship based on sound Biblical teaching and written in the language of the people (German) rather than the language of the Church (Latin). Half of the hymns have remained in use through the centuries and are included in our current hymnal, with some updated translations and different melodies.

How will we mark this anniversary?

- **Bible Hour Presentation:** Learn more about the first Lutheran hymnal in a special Bible Hour presentation on Sunday, October 13, 9:15 a.m., in the fellowship hall. Peter will share the history and guide you through the eight hymns included.
- The September issue of **Forward in Christ** magazine included an article on the 1524 hymnal by Pastor Michael Schultz, director of the 2021 hymnal project. A few copies are still available in the narthex.
- Area Reformation Service: St. Paul again hosts this year's Green Bay area celebration of the Lutheran Reformation on the afternoon of October 27, 4:00 p.m. Worship will include many of the hymns from the 1524 hymnal to mark this anniversary year. Pastor Mark Tiefel, who serves at Emmanuel Lutheran in New London, is the preacher. Special music from our Junior Choir, Praise Chimes, Church Choir, and instrumentalists adds to the celebration. We sing of the Lord's great love forever!

St. Paul Book of the Month: Parenting: 14 Gospel Principles That Can Radically Change Your Family by Paul David Tripp

What kind of family pictures do you show the world? It's the nice ones, the cute ones, the silly ones. Why never the messy ones? The pictures we often share don't show the whole story. They don't show the reality of what parenting often is because we are sinners raising sinners. This is important for you to understand about me, or anyone else you look at who you might think has it all together as a family or as a parent.

Apart from pictures you share online or with family and friends, what is your picture of successful parenting? It can't be just control of behavior, or that children will finally behave. If this is all it is, we're trying to accomplish what even pagans can potentially accomplish. While it is noble and good to want our kids to grow into well-adjusted productive members of society, they need something more if this is going to mean anything at all. They need something more if we want our parenting to have a positive eternal impact. It needs to be heart-focused.

This month's book helps to do just that. It's my favorite parenting book. It's not so much a "how to when...", though that is present. This book is heart-focused. It is focused on your heart as a parent so that you can be heart-focused for your child.

Paul David Tripp does an excellent job of applying law and gospel to our hearts as parents. Some of the reading will be painful as he exposes some of the greatest flaws/sins in our parenting. But those terrible accusations are always escorted by God's grace and forgiveness. Tripp constantly brings us back to the grace and cross of Christ.

I have developed a seminar for the Men of His Word conference on the topic of parenting making use of this book. I intend to flesh that out into multiple sessions, which we will hold right here at St. Paul in the not too distant future. Before then, why don't you get a head start and borrow this book from our church library. Better yet. Buy it for yourself. After the Bible, I think, if there is one parenting book to have on your shelf and read again and again, this is it. Find the healing — Pastor Ben Enstad and encouragement you need in these 14 gospel principles.

TELL: Connecting East Asia to the Philippines

TELL Network provides Bible study curriculum focused on leadership training for students across the globe, preparing them to gather groups, lead Bible studies, and plant churches. TELL is both the program name and a representation of the method used to teach the Bible: Think, Evaluate, Learn, and Lead. The training method is customized across four programs offered in English, Mandarin, Spanish, and Tagalog.

Students gain knowledge and confidence to lead others to the saving message of the gospel using the straight-forward and easy to remember training method. Based off the original *Academia Cristo* (TELL Spanish) curriculum, TELL Network students complete video courses, participate in live Zoom courses with theologically trained instructors, and learn to lead groups in their own communities.



The TELL program was designed with flexibility in mind. Its framework is made to be used in many countries, by many cultures, by many ages. Perhaps this is best displayed by Peter. Peter is a Ugandan, living in Hong Kong, training believers in the Philippines.

A few years ago, while living in Hong Kong, Peter was introduced to Asia Lutheran Seminary (ALS). He was interested in furthering his Biblical education when a pastor he knew in Canada encouraged him to study through ALS. He enrolled as a student and began completing classes regularly. This connection with ALS also led him to begin studying with the TELL program.

Peter's church in Hong Kong has a strong membership of Filipinos working in Hong Kong. As some of the members returned to the Philippines, they brought their worship life with them. They soon saw a need for small group leaders and for

training. Peter took the opportunity to put his own Biblical training into practice. He uses the TELL method to regularly meet online with eleven small group leaders from the Philippines. He chose to use the TELL method because: "I have been exposed to quite many Bible study methods, but I find TELL method cutting across all scenarios and levels, ages, and categories, a very easy way to administer Bible study. Also, for learners, no matter how much prior knowledge of the Bible they have, through TELL they will always learn something easily."

The TELL program is working with ALS and will soon be implemented more widely by our Asia One Team. We pray that God blesses the use of this program to reach and equip more leaders like Peter, leaders who are willing and ready to pass on their training and knowledge of the Bible to others!
